That could be what brought him there in the first place. I think Sarah is also the Sarah Wynne age 60 born in VA who appears on the 1850 Marshall Co MS census living with the family of James M. Trotter. Who else could that be?

Wynne's will from St. Francis Co. AR. His obit in the Nashville Christian Advocate says he died 1 Jan 1885. I think that's correct. His will was dated 13 Dec 1882, probated 14 Jan 1885 . In it he mentions all his daughters, including Margaret, and most important, her husband Jesse W. Wynne. The thing that has always made people think her name was Ross is the way it looks on her tombstone. The Wynnes are all buried at Hillcrest Cem Holly Springs MS and are at Findagrave.com with beautiful photos. Ross was Margaret's middle name and her mother's last name. I also found a bio of Jesse from 1899 in Confederate Military History that says he was Isham Wynne's grandson. That means I was right that Devereaux Wynne was Robert and Joel's uncle and guardian, not Robert's biological father. Robert was Jesse's biological father, and that's never been in dispute. I updated a lot of marriage and death records from the Shelby Co TN website Tom Leatherwood, Shelby County Register of Deeds so now my website www.baker-brady.com is as up to date as I can make it. Jesse's obit says he died on 2 May, so his tombstone is wrong on that. There were two papers in Memphis and both carried obits that agreed, and one had a photo that matched both of mine, except Jesse was older in theirs. was a rather mobile artiste. He was born in OH about 1826 and was rooming in Gallatin TN in 1860. In 1870 he lived in Prairie Co AR. By 1880 he had moved to Hot Springs. Balch personally autographed the back in pencil, and this was in Alice Wynne's 1865 album. Balch was probably traveling some sort of circuit to get more business, or it could be that the photo was taken before 1870.

Notes She apparently wasn't the daughter of Hugh Ross and Nancy Nash who came to TN from NC. I will speculate that the Margaret who was a daughter of Hugh Ross II who moved to TN from Anson Co NC in about 1810 is the same person. She is said to have married an S.E. Winn, had a daughter named after her who then married a Wynne whose first name started with a J. They lived in Forrest City AR and had several sons. Margaret Ross married her Winn in 1842 and died in 1845, which matches up

perfectly with this Margaret Ross. S.E. could really be J.E., and the name Wynne was spelled three different ways back then.

I now have some update info that will replace some of the data for these Wynnes at WorldConnect. I

have Joel E. Wynne's will from St. Francis Co. AR. His obit in the Nashville Christian Advocate says he died 1 Jan 1885. I think that's correct. His will was dated 13 Dec 1882, probated 14 Jan 1885. In it he mentions all his daughters, including Margaret, and most important, her husband Jesse W. Wynne. The thing that has always made people think her name was Ross is the way it looks on her tombstone. The Wynnes are all buried at Hillcrest Cem Holly Springs MS and are at Findagrave.com with beautiful photos. Ross was Margaret's middle name and her mother's last name. I also found a bio of Jesse from 1899 in Confederate Military History that says he was Isham Wynne's grandson. That means I was right that Devereaux Wynne was Robert and Joel's uncle and guardian, not Robert's biological father. Robert was Jesse's biological father, and that's never been in dispute. I updated a lot of marriage and death records from the Shelby Co TN website Tom Leatherwood, Shelby County Register of Deeds so now my website www.baker-brady.com is as up to date as I can make it. Jesse's obit says he died on 2 May, so his tombstone is wrong on that. There were two papers in Memphis and both carried obits that agreed, and one had a photo that matched both of mine, except Jesse was older in theirs. My thinking on the Wynne tombstones is that they were put up sometime after the deaths and so they have a few errors.

I'm guessing this is a Wynne. Balch was a very mobile photographer, but was in east AR by 1870. There's a good chance this could be "Bob" who was born in 1869 and died in 1871. His face strongly resembles the woman in the picture I believe to be of Captain Jesse Wynne and his wife Margaret.

Since there were other children of Jesse and Margaret who died in infancy, this could be any one of them. Dating the photo more precisely is hard to do since I believe that Balch the man who took the picture was traveling between Memphis and Hot Springs during the 1870s, and not tied to one location.

Compare the man in this photo to Wynne, Dennis and Beck. If this really is Jesse, then the woman has to be his wife, Margaret(Mag). She looks so very much like the Wynnes in my family, that I regard this as practically a certainty.

Joel E. Wynne was definitely the father of Jesse Wynne's wife. Martha Pointer Wynne's obit proves this by stating that the deceased was Mrs.(J.W.) Wynne's stepmother. The only thing I can't prove is that Margaret's mother was the d/o Hugh Ross II of Hickman Co. TN.
I now have Joel E. Wynne's will. In it he says that his daughter Margaret was married to Jesse W. Wynne. That should end all argument.

Capt.J.W.Wynne, then the senior member of the large mercantile firm of Wynne, Dennis & Beck, of this city, and now the senior member of the firm of Wynne, Love & Co. of Memphis, Tennessee, was elected its first President, a position which he held until he removed to Memphis. Capt.Wynne, son of Robert E. and Sarah Watkins Wynne, was born near Holly Springs, Mississippi, July 1,1839. With his parents he moved to Texas when quite young, and began his business career as a clerk in the store of James Flanagin, who was afterwards governor and United States senator from the state of Texas. Young Wynne was in charge of a branch store for Mr.Flanigan when the Civil War began. In May 1861, he enlisted in Company B, Third Texas Cavalry, with which as a private he fought in the battle of Wilson's Creek, Missouri, and several other skirmishes.

Promoted to first lieutenant in January 1862, he participated in the battles and skirmishes around Elkhorn, Missouri, under General Price and then being promoted to Captain in June, 1862, he commanded his company on the battlefields of Farmington, Iuka, and Corinth, Mississippi, as well as Resaca, Kennesaw Mountain and Atlanta, Georgia, and many other engagements, including those of Ross' brigade during Hood's campaign in Tennessee. He was wounded in the head at Wilson's Creek, Missouri, and in the arm at Resaca, Georgia, and at Jonesboro was captured but he and Adjutant Gregg, of the Third Texas, succeeded in taking their captors and turning them over to the Confederate guards. Just after the war, Captain Wynne settled for one year in Crittendon county, Arkansas, from where he moved to Madison, Arkansas in 1867, and formed a partnership with Mr. Frank A. Cherry, under the firm name of Cherry & Wynne; in 1868 the firm moved to Forrest City, where Mr. T.A. Hatcher was admitted under the firm name Cherry, Wynne & Hatcher.
